



The Greater Sandhill Crane is the only species of crane found in Northwest Colorado. The large birds, 4-5 ft tall, with grey feathers and a bright red skin patch on their forehead, return in the spring from wintering grounds in New Mexico and Arizona, to nest and raise their young in wetland areas throughout the Yampa Valley. During migration, in both the spring and fall, sandhills gather together in large flocks in long-established sites called "staging areas". Two main staging areas in Colorado are found along the Yampa River near Hayden and the Elk River west of Steamboat Springs. The Yampa Valley Crane Festival in September of each year celebrates the presence of these birds in Northwest Colorado.

Coloring Contest Rules:

1. Decorate the crane coloring contest picture using crayons, paint, markers, glitter, stickers, etc. Be creative.

3. On the back of the drawing include your **Name, Age and an email address where we can contact you.** *Incomplete entries will not be eligible for judging.* One entry per person allowed.
